## DETERMINED TO OUST CANNON

### Fierce Battle Wages Against House Rules For Many Hours

Washington, Feb 18.—With Speaker Cannon's power in the House of Representatives hanging in the balance, his supporters facing for time and no one in position to say what would be the outcome, the fiercest battle probably that ever had been waged against the House rules, obliterated party lines in the historic chamber.

It had been raging for six hours at 10 o'clock tonight, the hours when the regulars believed they could rally their strongest forces for the final clash that was to determine whether the Inauguration, Republican and Democratic coalition, were powerful enough to unhorse the regular organization. At that hour the Cannon forces were plainly in the minority and were flustered to prevent the crucial test. It had been reported by Republican Whip John Dwight, of New York, that reinforcements were coming from Philadelphia and New York and the Cannon men were hanging on like grim death in the hope that the handful of men opposed to be on the New York express would be sufficient to turn the tide.

## GREATER STRIKE TO BE CALLED

### Federation President Will Order a State-Wide Walk-Out Next Monday.

Philadelphia, March 18.—Nothing definite having been accomplished by the several conferences held today by persons interested in trying to bring a settlement of the street car men's strike, the committee of ten announced tonight that E. F. Greenwald, president of the State Federation of Labor, would call the State-wide strike on Monday next.

The labor leaders announce that they have already received assurances that Pittsburg, Erie, Norcross and Wilkes-barrs as well as a number of other points in the State will join in the movement.

## MURDERER TAKEN FOLLOWING CHASE

### Three Detectives Catch Desperate Man on Trolley Car and Fight Escapes

New York, March 18.—Following a chase through the streets and a desperate fight on a trolley car today, three detectives lodged in the West Side prison Alexander Devoe, the murderer of "Lefty" Boyle, who escaped from Sing Sing, where he was serving a life term on March 9.

Following the escape, the detectives took up a watch on Ida Burger, known to the underworld as "The Goodie" over whom the quarrel started that resulted in the killing of Boyle.

Last night they saw two men enter her house. The detectives tried to get in, but were refused admission, and took up positions about the house. Today the two men came out and started down the street on a run, with the detectives in pursuit. Lieutenant Muggs was outpacing the pair when they boarded the car. Muggs was the only one to go aboard and at once "mixed" it with the pair. Then he pulled the bell rope stopping the car. He drew his revolver and shoved it against Devoe's throat. The latter continued to struggle, but Lieutenant Toner and Gagnon came to his assistance and their brother officer and both men were overpowered.

A loaded revolver was found in Devoe's pocket and he said if he had known Muggs was an officer he would have killed him.

They will be given a hearing on the charge of being disorderly this afternoon at 2 o'clock.

## DATE IS SET FOR TOURNAMENT

### Meeting Held Last Night at the City Hall. July 25-30 Set as the Date.

At a meeting of the Bi-Centennial Committee last night at the city hall which was largely attended July 25-30 was the date set for the State Firemen's Tournament which is to be held in this city.

Mr. James D. McNeill, of Fayetteville, president of the State Firemen's Association was present and made a very interesting address to the committee in regards to this approaching event. Mr. McNeill stated that he would at once go into negotiations with the railroads traversing the State to get them to offer reduced rates and would report to the committee at an early date as to what disposition they would make of his request. He also advised them to secure every available place that could be used as a lodging house and to have the occupants if possible, to prepare to accommodate the visitors, of which it is estimated there will be about 2,000.

The amount to be donated by the city to the Association was one of the most important subjects discussed, and it was finally decided that the sum of \$1,500 should be set aside to be used as prizes this is the largest sum ever offered by any city in the State.

The Committee on arrangements will at once begin to prepare their plans and get the track in proper condition, and also to erect a large grand stand on each side of the track.

Mr. McNeill predicts that the tournament this year will be by far the most successful one ever held.
