Tazewell, Va., March 30—The twelve year-old daughter of Charles Kinder was shot in the temple last night about 9 o'clock and very serious but not fatally wounded by one of the two men who were passing through the valley, they said, on their way from the cost fields to their homes in North Carolina. They gave their names as Long and

The two men stopped at Kinder's house about dark, saying that they had lost their way, and asked for a night's lodging. This was refused and the men were directed on their way.

After leaving the house they began firing revolvers, one ball going into Kinders house, striking the little girl as above stated. The men were arrested and are now in jail. They claim they hot at a rabbit and did not intend shoot ing toward the house. There was strong talk of a lynching in the yalley. but the prompt arrival of the sheriff and his sae prevented trouble.

Philadelphis, March 30—The Pennsylvania Railroad Co. has made a voluntary increase of 6 per cent in the pay of all employes who flow get less than 300 per month. The railse is to be effective April 1st. About 155,600 men are affected. Notices have been posted at all points on the lines east of littsburg. It is understood that a similar advance will apply on the lines west of Pittsburg the barg. On the lines west of Pittsburg the Pennsylvania Railroad employe about 123,000 men, the western system 58,000 more.
