### PARENTS SEARCH ENDS AT CORPSE

**Finds Body of Four Year Old Son With Life Crushed Out**

Norfolk, Va., March 31.—With its life head crushed and life extinct, the body of a four-year-old John Willard Pope was found under a pile of heavy timber in the lumber yard of D Etheredge and Company, in Brambleton ward, last evening.

The little fellow had a few hours before been dressed for the evening by his mother at 110 South Waltham avenue, not far from where the body was found and while she went in the kitchen to prepare supper for her husband, the boy wandered away to the lumber yard.

His parents and neighbors did not know where the boy had gone and several hours was spent searching for him. When his father came home from work some children told him little John was missing and he too joined in the search. Then it was whispered that the little fellow had been seen going in the direction of the lumber yard. When the father reached the yard, Thomas Walker and several other searchers had just removed the body from a pile of lumber.

It is thought that the child tried to climb up the pile of timber and that the board slipped and fell on him.

The mother is bearing up bravely under her terrible bereavement. Little John was the only son although there is a little girl left to cheer the heart broken parents.

### FLEET'S BASE IS MOVED

**German Battleship Will Go to Wilhelmshafen**

Berlin, March 31.—Germany has inaugurated a new era in the naval strategy. It was announced some time ago that she would remove her battle ship base from the Baltic to the North Sea, and then the first squadron of the high sea fleet consisting of eight battle ships and four cruisers, left Kiel and passed through the North Sea canal for maneuvers in the neighborhood of Heligoland.

After the maneuvers the squadron will not return to Kiel, but will go to the new headquarters at Wilhelmshafen, where after six years, the work of constructing a new harbor, dockyards, and fortifications is completed. Thus Germany's main naval base is brought within 325 miles of the chief English North Sea base, Sherness.

The fleet will thus be permanently quartered where, henceforth, according to general prediction, its future field of warfare lies.

### TRUNKS OF POSTAGE STAMPS

**Recovered By Police Were Stolen From Richmond Post Office**

New York, March 31.—Five trunks and a valise, which contained about \$70,000 worth of stamps, have been recovered by the police and post office inspectors. This is a large part of the \$80,000 worth of postage stamps and \$3,000 in cash taken from the Richmond post office early on last Monday morning.

The first trunk which was found at the Grand Central depot on Tuesday, had approximately \$27,000 worth of stamps. The second trunk was found at the Avon Hotel, Lexington Avenue and Thirtieth Street. It contained tools and clothing, and was found in the room of the prisoner known as Chester.

A third trunk was found with the Westcott Express Company at the foot of West Twenty-third Street. This also contained tools and clothing, and supposed to belong to the prisoner Cunningham, who has been identified as Eddie Fay, one of the most notorious burglars and yeggmen in the county.

The fourth trunk was secured at the Grand Central depot on information obtained from Newark, and it contained \$17,500 worth of stamps. The police learned that the post-office inspectors seized a valise at the St. Denis Hotel which contained \$8,500 worth of stamps.
