TEAMSTERS JOIN IN THE STRIKE

They Take a Hand With the Stemmers in the American Tobacco Company.

Louisville, Ky., April 7.—The local Teamsters' Union today took a hand in the strike of the stemmers in the American Tobacco Company's factories here and prevented the removal of the large amount of leaf from one of the closed factories. The American Tobacco Company tried today to move several dry, loads of tobacco from their Thirty-first and Walnut street plant, presumably to the depot for shipment to Richmond Va. when girl strikers stopped the drays and entreated the drivers to refuse to handle the goods. The drivers promised to take their teams to the barns after handling the first load and proceeded down town, only to be stopped a few blocks from the factory by a representative of the Teamsters' Union who ordered the drays returned with their loads to the tobacco factories.

There were several disturbances in the tobacco district during the night but no serious trouble.

NO TRAIN STOPPING

Passengers and Mail Unloaded While Going at 80 Mile Gait.

Washington, D. C., April 7.—Rapid transit beyond the dreams of other men has been offered to the Postoffice Department by an Effingham (Ill.) inventor. The Illinois man has a scheme to run a railroad train at the rate of 80 miles an hour for 500 miles without stopping. He would unload passengers, mail and baggage while the train was in motion. His device would whirl the most delicate passenger out of the car and into the station without lessening the speed of the train or injuring the passenger. It would do the same with mail, he says. On the grounds that Congress gave to the Postoffice Department no authority to buy railroad equipment the invention has been declined, but the inventor has written to President Taft offering free use of the scheme and suggesting that his appointment as chairman of the Panama Canal Commission will be considered adequate return for a short while, anyway.
