## NEW BERN'S NEW UNION DEPOT

Plans Were Accepted Tuesday Morning and Work Will Begin in a Few Days.

At a meeting held at the office of the Sec of the Chamber of Commerce Tuesday morning between the committee representing the Chamber of Commerce Board of Aldermen and citizens of New Bern, final plans for the union passenger station were submitted by Superintendent Walker and Messrs. Mechanical Mathews of the Norfolk & Southern Ry. and the same were proved and accepted. Work will begin in about ten days and in a short while New Bern will possess a very handsome and commodious union passenger station.

A very pleasing feature in connection with this station, in addition to the modern conveniences that will be afforded is that a beautiful driveway forty feet or more in width will extend from Griffith St. to the station, a distance of about one hundred and fifty feet on the north side of Queen street. New Bern is to be congratulated on securing this much needed improvement and too much credit can not be given to the joint committees who have labored for over a year in co-operation with the railroad in bringing this happy issue to an end.

We believe that this passenger station but the beginning of a line of improvements to be carried on by the railroad around New Bern from now on, with new shops, new station paved streets, improved schedules, canals opening up traffic between the East and New Bern and from New Bern to the ocean via Beaufort and home capital co-operating with outside capital in the building up of industries, New Bern has got a destiny before her of which the outside world will have to sit up and take due notice.

### Points Regarding the Census Taking

The census begins April 15, and must be completed in two weeks in cities and in thirty days in all other areas. The enumerators will wear a badge inscribed "United States Census, 1910." The law requires every adult person to furnish the prescribed information but also provides that it shall be treated confidentially, so that no injury can come to any person from answering the questions.

The President has issued a proclamation calling on all citizens to co-operate with the Census and assuring them that it has nothing to do with taxation, army or jury service, compulsory school attendance, regulation of immigration, or enforcement of any law, and that no one can be injured by answering the inquiries.

It is of the utmost importance that the census of population and agriculture in this State be complete and correct.

Therefore every citizen should promptly, accurately, and completely answer the Census questions asked by the enumerators.

## RIOTS BY JEWISH WOMEN

Attack Koshor Restaurant Forcing Them to Close—Fierce Fight in Market

New York, April 13—The most riotous of the Jewish women, who demand that all Koshor restaurants remain closed until the price of meat is reduced broke out afresh in the Williamsburg district of Brooklyn and shortly before noon several hundred women attacked all the Jewish meat markets, forcing all but one one to close.

The market run by Salvador Hart was opened and seventy-five women "rushed it," and it took police reserves to keep them from wrecking the place. The wholesale and retail poultry store of Morris Cohen was raided and kerosene oil poured over all meat. Cohen seized one of the women and locked her in his private office, but the women burst down the door and rescued her.

## FIRE DESTROYS FIVE HOUSES

Reizenstein Town Swept by the Flames Early Yesterday Morning.

Five dwelling houses, four of which were the property of Mr. J. L. Hahn, and one belonging to Charles Midgette which were located in the western section of the city in a locality known as Reizenstein Town were totally destroyed by fire at an early hour yesterday morning.

For some unknown reason the gong at the fire house failed to ring and it was necessary for Chief Richardson to go down and awake the drivers of the hose wagons and to have the alarm rung by hand. This caused quite a delay, and by the time they had reached the scene of the conflagration the house belonging to Chas Midgette was wrapped in flames.

On unloading their hose it was found that the entire length carried in both wagons would have to be used in getting one stream on the blaze, the nearest hydrant being located quite a distance from the fire.

A conveyance was dispatched to the 6th ward fire house to obtain another supply of hose. This caused another delay and when they had at last secured the proper facilities for combatting the flames they were entirely beyond the control of the fire fighters and before it could be extinguished five dwellings were burned down.

If the fire alarm system had not been out of order and the firemen had arrived on the scene when the fire was first discovered the loss which is estimated to be about \$1,500 would have doubtless been much less.
