THE MATTER OF LOCOMOTION.

The news report that the 100,000th automobile license has been issued in New York state, and that licenses are being issued at the rate of 260 a day, is an interesting item. This is but one state, and it must be remembered that in every state this same automobile licensing is going on, tho' not of course to the same extent.

This matter of human locomotion is a study. The bicycle, the auto, the airship, three means, where the individual becomes the server and the served. The horse, the mule, the ox, each in place and degree were means, and are today, tho' their services are not so important or necessary to man in the locomotion line. From the human view point, the animal locomotion service was slow, while the machine service is as fast as the individual will assume the risk. The animal was cheaper, the machine is high. And yet with the passing of the animal as a means of locomotion, thus in the way of passenger and draught service upon city streets and the country highways, yet the horse and mule apparently eliminated from services that have required thousands annually to fill the trade demand, are in price the highest ever known. Power as the locomotion method for individual pleasure and business needs will increase in use. That this is truly indicative of prosperity is a question, for every city where automobiles are used in numbers, there will be found many mortgages to offset, which the machine purchase has made necessary. This also has been true as regards the farmer, who bought horse or mule for his farm, but in the latter case the purchase, even if mortgaged, becomes an active factor to pay off his mortgage. The auto will not do this. But the argument comes back, changed conditions demand a readjustment of all things, and not least it is the plan of economics which must be changed to meet the situation.
