SUICIDAL WOUND FATAL TO SLAYER

John Going, Who Killed Sweet heart and Shot Self Dies From Injuries Lynchburg, V., May 11.—John Going who on Sunday shot and killed Miss Nellie Banton, during a jealous frenzy and then turned the weapon on himself died Monday afternoon about 3 o'clock from the effects of his self-inflicted wound.

Young Going declared his intention of killing himself some time during the past week, and his parents had secreted all of the weapons in the home for fear that he would carry out his threat. In some way, however, he got possession of a shotgun and a pistol and disappeared from home Saturday afternoon. It is believed now that he went for the purpose of laying in wait for his rival.

He was placed under arrest as soon as he could be taken to his home and the house was put under guard. He died about twenty-four hours later.

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Proceedings April Meeting, Jurors Drawn For June Term Superior Court.

Meeting of the Board of County Commissioners May 2nd, 1910. The board met at 11 o'clock a. m. May 2nd, 1910.

Commissioners present: Acting Chairman A. E. Wadsworth, G. V. Richardson, J. B. Harvey, J. S. McGowan, and County Attorney E. M. Green. Henry Spence colored, of No. 8 township, appeared before the board and asked that he be relieved from poll tax on account of infirmity.

The following persons were drawn to serve as jurors at a term of Superior Court for the trial of criminal cases, to be held on the second Monday in June, 1910, it being the 13th day of June, 1910 to-wit:

- No. 1 township—F. M. Morris, J. L. Wethington, Andrew Franks, T. R. Franks, C. W. Wethington, J. L. Bland, K. L. Dixon, Macon Willis T. L. White, N. E. Gaskins.

Ordered by the board that a voucher for \$5.00 be issued for Celia J. Sutton, for services rendered small pox patients. Ordered that a voucher be issued for \$9.00 in favor of W. F. Gilbert, the same for the purpose of refunding certain money paid into the hands of the County Treasurer by Mr. W. M. Watson through mistake, the same to be charged against fines and forfeitures of the county.

Ordered that the clerk notify Mr. S. W. Smallwood, of New Bern, N. C. Pocomoke Gun Co., Norfolk, Va., and D. P. Martin Fertilizer Co., Richmond, Va., to appear before the board at its regular meeting on the first Tuesday in June to show cause why certain property assessed against them on the delinquent list should not be taxed.

Ordered that a voucher for \$15.55 be issued to Mr. Ashford. Whereas, it is provided by section 72, chapter 4, laws of 1901, being a public school law, that upon the petition of one of the freeholders within a proposed special school district, and endorsed by the school board of education of the county, an election should be held in said district to ascertain the will of the people for the establishment of such district.

Beginning at the mouth of Core Creek on the south side of Neuse river, and runs up Core Creek to the mouth of Flat Swamp, thence up said Flat Swamp to the mouth of Sassafras Branch, thence up said Sassafras Branch to Eugenia Jones' line, thence with Eugenia Jones' line and Jesse W. Jones' line to M. D. Lane's 196 acre Gilstrap land line, (bought from R. T. Crook, and wife) thence with M. D. Lane's southern line of said Gilstrap land to Blue Pond tract, and the John D. Wooten southern line to A. R. Smith and F. R. Smith's line, thence with said Smith's southern line to the line of Turkey Trap lands, thence with Turkey Trap's eastern line to the southern line of the Cobb lands now owned by J. A. Robinson, E. Harris, W. C. White, M. D. Lane and others, thence with the line of the Cobb lands to the line of the late Frank E. Gaskins, bought by E. P. Hartley and others, thence with the line of E. P. Hartley and L. B. Cox lands to Neuse river, then down Neuse river to the mouth of Core Creek, the beginning, the same having been approved by the county board of education.

It is hereby ordered that an election be held in said district on Saturday, June 4th, 1910, at the regular meeting place in the town of Park View, the polls to be opened from 8 o'clock a. m. to 5 p. m.
