

"The world is looking on," said Pro

esor Hays, "while the farmers plod along in our morganized, unsystematic half-hearted way, and the world be-lieve that were our people broader and better trained we could produce right. Whether our activity be religious, & Co. social, political, or economic, we are on the 15 bushel basis with a 25 bushel pportunity."

Professor Hays declared that the agricultural high school at Crockston was the nucleus of the cure for these troubles. He advocated the extension of consolidated rural schools idea thoughout Minnesota—the institutions where farming is taught in addition to he "three R's,"
