STRENGTH OF THE DIS-AFFECTED.

Men do not always leave a political party for pecuniary gain. They do not always leave because of failure to receive political reward. But men do leave because of individual convictions that fail to coincide with those of the party they have hitherto affiliated with.

From an impartial view point, it would seem that a political party, the same as any organization would be the one to seek to reclaim any member that had become disaffected and inclined to leave, rather than hurling foul abuse at him and consigning him to the hot place.

The man who changes his party in North Carolina, particularly within the last few years, from the Democratic to the Republican, has had much to contend within way of abuse because of his action.

There are some notable cases of men in this state, who as democrats, were held as honorable men, good citizens. But changing their party, to judge from the criticism, rather tirades hurled against them, it has been the surprise of many how they were even permitted to remain in the democratic party.

The reason for this abuse must prove to every observing person, that these disaffected ones have personality and their leaving has a basis that calls for some display to cover up the cause. Morehead, McNinch, and rearer home, Ireddell Meares are notable disaffected men, who have taken up active work in Republican State politics.

Referring to the case of Ireddell Meares it took some four columns in Sunday's Raleigh News-Observer in contra version Mr. Meares' statement of his position. A man who can receive such wholesale attention from the political organ of a party must have an individuality not to be sneered at. At no time during the years when Mr. Meares worked in democracy's interests, and he was a good, sincere worker, has he found his personality such an important factor in North Carolina politics.

Might it not be political wisdom on the part of the democratic party to speed such men as the above with regrets, with the idea of their return, rather than make their leaving a season of brimstone and sulphur, with words that some day may have to be recalled, if it were possible!

The Talipot Palm of Ceylon. The talipot palm of Ceylon has gigantic fanlike leaves, which while fully expanded form a nearly complete circle thirteen feet in diameter. Large fans made of them are carried before people of rank among the Chingalese. They are also commonly used as umbrellas, and tents are made by neatly joining them together. They are used as a substitute for paper, being written upon with a stylus. Some of the sacred books of the Chingalese are composed of strips of them.
