MOUNTAINEER SHOT WHILE CARRYING

Baby. Unwritten Code of Kentuckians is Thrown to The Winds.

Albany, N. Y., Sept. 23.—The unwritten code of the Kentucky mountaineers was broken through the heart by a sharpshooting mountain assassin, the bullet penetrating the baby's dress. It has always been a point of chivalry, even among the wilds, not to fire upon a man when a woman or child might be endangered. To carry a child in arms heretofore has been an inviolable means of protection.

"Doc" Mole, who had given information of the government revenue officers, started for court to testify against some of his "moonshiners" neighbors who had been arrested as a consequence of his story. Mole knew that his life was in danger so he carried his 9-month-old baby in his arms to prevent being fired upon. This time the code failed.

An assassin, hidden by the roadside, shot Mole. The bullet drilled through the infant's garment and Mole rolled into the dust dead. There is no clue to the murderer.

Portsmouth, Va., Sept. 23.—With one battalion of soldiers, a detachment of light artillery with eight heavy guns, and three armored cruisers all held in readiness today to quell violence, a war between the oyster men along the James river and the Virginia fish commissionaries, over the restrictions imposed on the fishermen by the authorities, is imminent, this afternoon. Commissionaries hope a truce may be effected but the oyster men are ready to defend what they term their rights with blood should it be necessary. GAYNOR WILL BE PARTY NOMINEE

Democrats to Name Him for Governorship at Convention in Rochester.

New York, Sept. 23.—That Mayor William J. Gaynor will be nominated by the Democratic State convention at Rochester next week as its gubernatorial candidate and that he will be bitterly opposed by the Hearst followers, was the openly expressed opinion of well informed Democrats here today. Gaynor is the personal choice of Chairman of the State Committee, Dix, who left here today for Albany, and he has privately assured his friends that the New York mayor would sweep the state if named and that in doing so he would put out of existence the Hearst machine, which has menaced the party success in the past.

Leader Murphy, of Tammany Hall, does not want Gaynor nominated for governor. He would prefer that some of the other candidates be named. Inasmuch as he realizes the candidacy of Gaynor will spell trouble for Tammany in its local fights here with Hearst opposing the Democratic ticket simply because Gaynor heads it.

Just what Hearst will do in the big problem among the Democrats today. In his newspaper today he bitterly assailed New York's mayor for his recent letter to his sister in which Gaynor accuses the Hearst papers of "printing lies and slanders" and of being responsible for his attempted assassination. If Roosevelt controls the State convention at Saratoga and names a progressive ticket it is believed that Hearst might support the Republican ticket and throw his influence toward its election. If not, and Gaynor is the Democratic nominee, Hearst is expected to put a complete State ticket in the field and do everything possible to defeat Gaynor.

REFUSES TO BURY WIFE AND CHILDREN

This Fact Causes the Police to Suspect Soos of Slaying Them.

West Chester, Pa., Sept. 23.—Mike Skimko and John Poporich, two foreigners, were lodged in the county jail here early today as suspects in the murder of Mrs. Anna Soos and her 3 children near Phoenixville. They were taken from their home near Coatsville, at 9 o'clock this morning by detectives Skirrip following an all night chase in an automobile.

Poporich was believed to be the man whom John Soos, the husband and father of the murderer, named to the detective last night as the one with whom he had recently quarreled.

When confronted by Soos later in the day, the latter could not identify either. Soos declared one of the men to be the wrong Poporich, and that Skimko had never boarded with him. Both of them were released.

Soos was detained over night in the Chester county jail, and will be arraigned today. The county authorities are inclined to the belief that he knows more about the crime than he is willing to tell.

"I am going to hold this man until further investigation is made," declared county detective Jeffries today. "His actions have been rather suspicious and we cannot possibly let him go."

The chief points against Soos are his anxiety to get out of this country and his callous disregard for the dead by refusing to bear the funeral expenses.

His many friends in this city will learn with sincere regret that Mr. W. M. Watson, Clerk of Craven County Superior Court is critically ill at Johns Hopkins hospital, Baltimore. Mr. Watson left here several days ago to visit his daughter Mrs. Thos. Lee Craig, at Gastonia. While there he was taken ill and after a consultation between the physicians at that place he was taken to Baltimore to be operated upon. A telegram received from the hospital yesterday afternoon by Mr. J. W. Watson stated that the operation had not yet been performed on account of the serious condition of the patient.

Bodies Found in The Maine

Havans, Sept. 24.—Forty-five divers, under Chief Herdome McDermham, have begun work on the Maine. Several bodies have been found in the cabin, but remain untouched, following Captain Ferguson's orders. The hull lies in mud six feet deep at the bow and six and one-half feet at the stern. The Government Commissioners maintain a strict secrecy about all matters relating to the Maine.
