## WILLMAN TO MAKE SECOND ATTEMPT

Noted Aviator Will Make Another Attempt to Cross the Atlantic Ocean.

Atlantic City, N. J., Oct. 25.—Walter Willman's second attempt to cross the Atlantic ocean in a dirigible balloon will start from Atlantic City. This announcement was made yesterday by Joseph W. Salus, head of the local syndicate which backed Willman's first attempt to fly over to Europe.

"The probabilities of another attempt to cross the ocean in a dirigible are very bright," said Mr. Salus. "Mr. Willman has decided to make this city the base of action. The big hangar which housed the America will be kept intact for use again."

Mr. Willman left for New York today to prepare for his lecture. All of the members of the America's expedition, with the exception of the navigator, F. Murray Simon, will soon start on theatre tours or vaudeville trips from New York.

## FEDERAL COURT NOW IN SESSION

Two Weeks Term Convened in This City Yesterday Morning.

A two weeks term of U. S. Circuit and District Court convened in this city yesterday morning with Judge H. G. Connor, of Wilson, N. C. presiding. At the opening of the session Judge Connor made a few well-timed remarks after which the following grand jury was drawn:

During the day this body was kept busy examining witnesses and a number of true bills were returned.

The first case called was that of the U. S. vs Oscar White, who was charged with retailing. The jury returned a verdict of guilty but no sentence has yet been passed.

In the case of L A Randolph, of Pitt county, who was charged with using the mails for fraudulent purposes, a special verdict was ordered by the court.

The case of the U. S. vs Frank Sutton, who was charged with operating an illicit distillery was next called. The giving of testimony in this case and the arguments of the counsel consumed much time and it was late in the afternoon before the jury were given the case.

At a late hour last night no verdict had been rendered by the jury.

## SAY ROOSEVELT ROASTED JUDGE

Called Judge A. B. Anderson a Jackass and Crook According to Report.

Indianapolis, Ind., Oct. 25th.—That Theodore Roosevelt denounced the decision of Judge A. B. Anderson in the Panama libel suit in Indianapolis as that "of a jackass and a crook" is a story told under cover by members of the exclusive Columbia club in this city. The statement of Mr. Roosevelt was said to have been made in the hearing of several of the club members when Roosevelt was in Indiana recently campaigning for Senator Albert J. Beveridge; and it has aroused a feeling of the deepest resentment here.

The alleged denunciation of Judge Albert B. Anderson as a "jackass and crook" by Colonel Theodore Roosevelt on a recent visit to Indianapolis is still the most important gossip of local, political and club circles.

Inasmuch as the statement accredited to Mr. Roosevelt was made while the latter was a guest at the Columbia club, the club officials are loath to talk the matter outside the clubrooms.
