OF COURSE IT WAS LOADED

Used Magazine Pistol Instead of Toy at Rehearsal.
\$400 Bail.

Philadelphia, Nov. 11.—His cheeks wet with tears, 13-year-old Perot Nevin, of No. 2025 Spruce street, is held in \$500 bail to await a coroner's jury inquest into the death of Theodore Delaney, 14 years old, whom he held up at a dramatic rehearsal.
The boys and several third form companions of the Blight school last winter saw "The Round Up" and were eager to play the western drama. They rehearsed at different houses using a toy cap pistol. But on Monday while in Nevin's home their host found his brother's magazine pistol. He did not know that it was loaded or that it would explode at the slightest pressure.
"Hold up your hands," Nevin commanded and Delaney raised them. The pistol was discharged and Delaney sank with a cry to the floor. Nevin, dazed, unconsciously pressed the trigger again and the second bullet grazed the head of Howie Adams, son of Dr. J. Howe Adams.

By this time Miss Dorothy Nevin Perot's 19 year old sister, one of the season's debutantes, arrived and taking the pistol from her brother, proceeded to dress Delaney's injuries. She sent several of the children for physicians, but the boy was dead when they reached the house.

No Christmas Leave for Cadets.

Bumper Crops For 1910 Are Reported

Washington, Nov. 11.—Bumper crops, led by corn with the greatest harvest ever gathered, were produced by the farmers of the United States during this year. In a general review of crop conditions issued today the bureau of statistics of the Department of Agriculture says:

"The harvests of 1910 have been practically completed, with results exceeding the expectations during the growing period. Preliminary estimates have been made of the production of most of the important crops, from which it appears that the aggregate production of crops in 1910 are approximately 7.6 per cent, greater than the crops of 1909, and about 9.1 per cent, greater than the average annual production of the preceding five years. Prices for important crops averaged on November 1 about 5.4 per cent, lower than a year ago.

"The production of other crops in 1910, expressed in percentage of the average production in recent years (not compared with full crops), is estimated as follows:

"Peaches 112.1; hops 104.9; broom corn 105.4; cranberries 106.4 sweet potatoes 104.3; sorghum 104.6; snapbeans 102.5; peanuts 102.5; ashbuds 100.2; lima beans 100.0; kaffir corn 99.1; peas 98.5; beans (dry) 98.5; cantaloupes 97.5; watermelons 97.0; onions 96.5; hemp 96.5; tomatoes 93.7; clover seed 93.6; strawberries 91.5; grapes 88.2; apples 85.3; millet seed 85.7; raspberries 78; blackberries 75.6.

"The condition of other crops compared with average conditions at or near time of gathering was as follows: "Sugar cane 104.1; rice 102.3; sugar beets 100.0; lemons 99.3; cotton 98.4; oranges 95.5."

THE BIG CA- NAL IS SOLD

Located in Virginia and North Carolina. It Brought \$300,000.

Norfolk, Va., Nov. 11.—The property of the Albemarle and Chesapeake Canal Co. in Virginia and North Carolina, consisting of a 10 1/2 mile canal and several thousand acres of land were sold under foreclosure at Portsmouth, Va., yesterday to a committee representing first mortgage bondholders for \$300,000. This is a link in the proposed governmental intracoastal waterway between Boston and Beaufort, N. C., and has already been recommended for such use by army engineers.

The sale was to satisfy a \$500,000 thirty year bond issue given in 1879 to the Union Trust Company of New York, trustees. A second mortgage of \$250,000 was held by the Central Trust Co., of New York. The only bid yesterday was by the first mortgage bondholding committee, composed of James M. Edwards, Robert L. Harrison and Henry T. Cutter, of New York. The property will be offered to the government for \$500,000.

THE SITUATION VERY GRAVE

Expressmen's Strike in New York is Growing More Critical and State and Federal Government May Collide.

New York, Nov. 11.—Possibilities of a clash between State and Federal authorities over the express strike complications have intensified interest in the warfare between the express deliverers and companies. The prospect of injunction may be invoked to prevent further seizures, such as made of several express wagon drivers by uniformed drivers under Mayor Gaynor's order. Besides ten thousand drivers of express and delivery wagons about three thousand taxicab chauffeurs are on a strike. The express business is virtually at a stand-still. A general strike of teamsters in sympathy with the men now out is imminent. The first move to tie up an established transportation line occurred this morning when sixty-two chauffeurs of the Fifth Avenue Coach Company went out on a strike. Two hundred and fifty drivers of the big coal company also went out. A general walk-out of coal deliverers is threatened.

WILL DISCUSS THE PROGRAM

Taft Has Program Which he Hopes to Rush Through, But the Chances Seem Slim.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 11.—Republican leaders will be called to the White House when President Taft returns from Panama, to discuss the rush-through legislative program for the coming session of Congress. As the session must end on March 4th, and will mark the passing of Republican control, diplomacy will be needed to get as much as possible out of this "last chance."

Opinions of regulars and progressives will be sought as to the most important measures that will command the votes necessary for passage. In official circles it is believed that time for Administration bills may be hard to obtain because there will be turbulent efforts by Republicans in general and especially by the scores about to retire to private life to get bills in which they or their districts are particularly interested through the "last chance" crash. "Speed" will be the slogan and night sessions will be demanded in the latter part of the session to boom the production.

While bills are going through, attention must be given to the providing of roots for as many as possible of about one hundred "lame ducks." Forecasts are that a number of commissions of investigation will be found necessary to the welfare of the government. Evils will be found that call for legislation, but concerning them there will be a lack of information. Hence the high-salaried commissions.

President Taft has a big program of legislation which he hopes to get through. He will explain his desires to the legislative leaders, and it is now expected that his message will be framed with an idea of putting forward such measures as it seems possible to pass. The program may be cut down, but a strenuous effort will be made to force through as much as possible.
