Very few marriage licenses have been issued in this city this month. Last month was a record breaker and cupid evidently is resting up after so much strenuous work.

There was ice in this vicinity Monday morning, early, but the temperature after day light continued to rise until it was about 30 degrees higher than before sun rise.

Mr. Geo. Waters has recently installed one of the most modern hot drink outfits in the city and is now ready to serve his customers with the best that can be obtained in that line.

At the present time there are very few patients receiving treatment at Stewart's Sanatorium. A few weeks ago this institution was crowded to its utmost capacity with injured patients.

The debris of the fire that destroyed a number of dwelling houses on north Bern street a few days ago is being cleared away and it is understood that new structures will be erected in their stead.

Mayor McCarthy's court yesterday afternoon consisted mainly of cases of disorderly conduct. There were only three cases on the docket however and but a short while was consumed in the session.

The Department of Household Economics of the Woman's Club will hold their first cooking demonstration in the kitchen of the graded school Thursday afternoon at 4 o'clock. All ladies invited to attend.

Over fifty baskets of fine lettuce was shipped Monday to Baltimore and Philadelphia markets by Mr. Edward Clark from his beds near the city. The above was the largest shipment, though Mr. Clark has been shipping for several weeks.

Rapid strides are now being made toward the completion of the new Union passenger depot. The concrete floors that will be used throughout the building are now being laid and in a few days the plasterers will be ready to begin their work.

Work was received here of the death at Washington D. C., of Lt. E. A. Smith, who is known to some in New Bern. He was the father of Mr. Josh Smith of this city. Lt. Smith was a G. A. R. man and he will be buried in Arlington cemetery.

Mr. J. O. Baxter, the jeweler, has on exhibition in his show window on Middle street a very elaborate display of articles suitable for Christmas gifts. This event is fast approaching and if you are contemplating purchasing now is the time to do so.

The local market was again well supplied with oysters yesterday. During the morning a number of boat loads arrived in port and these were disposed of to local dealers and consumers. The quality of the bivalves just at this time is exceptionally good.

The funeral services of the late John T. Heath will be held next Sunday Nov. 20, three o'clock p. m. at the family burying ground near the home of the deceased, about 5 miles from Trenton on Pollockville road. Everybody is invited to attend and Masons are invited to participate.

The condition of Mr. Noah Harrison, of Chockowinity, who was taken to the Stewart Sanatorium last Saturday to receive treatment for a shot wound inflicted by a negro highwayman near Oriental last Friday afternoon, is greatly improved. Mr. Harrison's assailant is still at large.

This is at least the fifth delegation that has visited the city during the past few weeks.
