## PREPARATIONS ARE BEING MADE

### Wilmington Preparing for Coming of Congress to Discuss Drainage.

Wilmington, Nov. 16.—Arrangements for the third annual meeting of the North Carolina Drainage Association, which will be held in this city November 22 and 23, are being rapidly perfected by the local committee with the assistance of the officers of the organization. The committee, of which William E. Springer is chairman, has been advised by Assistant Secretary Hill, of the treasury department, that the revenue cutter Seminole may be used for the proposed trip down the river on the morning of November 23, provided the cutter is not called out on urgent business. The river trip will be a decided feature of the gathering.

Advices received here from Dr. Joseph Hyde Pratt, secretary, and J. A. Brown the president, indicate that there will be in attendance at the convention between 400 and 500 delegates. In addition to the members of the association there will be present a large number of others who are interested in drainage projects. Among the distinguished speakers for the meeting are Congressman John H. Small and Congressman H. L. Godwin.

## PACIFIC COAST DEFENSELESS

### General Wood Makes Startling Report on Weakness, Politics Back of Danger.

Washington, Nov. 15th.—The United States is not prepared to repel an attempted invasion of the Pacific Coast. This statement, ascertained from undisputed authority, is the final analysis of the military weakness of the country set forth in the report of Gen. Leonard Wood, as chief of staff of the army, in reply to a resolution by Representative McLaughlin, of California, passed at the last session of Congress, calling for a statement as to the preparedness of the nation to resist invasion in case of war with an Asiatic power.

The report, which is said to be the most comprehensive expose of the condition of the army ever made public, will attribute the deficiency of the military forces to several primary causes. It will set forth that the dissection of the army into small military units necessary to garrison scores of so called "political posts" throughout the country has denied both officers and men adequate military training.

Recommendation will be made for the reorganization of the army, the abandonment of all unnecessary posts; the increasing of the infantry line by 25 regiments and the field artillery by 7 regiments and the concentration of troops in large garrisons on the two ocean frontiers.

The garrisoning of Hawaii, the Canal Zone and the Pacific Coast will be set forth as an immediate military necessity.

## HUGHES NOT THE YOUNGEST

### He Will Lack this Distinction, If Taft Appoints Him Chief Justice.

Washington, Nov. 15.—Should Associated Justice Charles E. Hughes be made Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States he will not only be the youngest member of the present Supreme Bench, but the youngest presiding justice, save two, in the history of the court.

John Jay, appointed in 1789 by President Washington, was at that time 35 years of age, and John Marshall, appointed in 1801, was 46.

Hughes is now 48 years old. There have been eight Chief Justices since the creation of the court, in 1789—Jay, who was 35 at the time of his selection; Rutledge, 56; Ellsworth, 51; Marshall, 46; Taney, 59; Chase, 56; Waite, 58, and Fuller, 55.

Every one of the present justices of the Supreme Court is at least 13 years older than Hughes. Harlan, who has been presiding justice since Chief Justice Fuller's death is 67; White, 55; McKenna, 57; Holmes, 59; Day, 51, and Lurton, 56.

Practitioners before the court have recalled the history of the first presiding justice, John Jay. He was selected by Washington to head the court in 1789, but resigned shortly after to become Governor of New York. Now the court has claimed the Governor of New York, reversing the process.

### A Valuable Bulletin.

They cause large loss, cutting down the yield of grain, often as much as 20 per cent or over, 30 per cent, while the stinking smut of wheat does a greater damage by injuring the milling quality of the grain. The formalin treatment which is thoroughly effective and costs almost nothing, is described and recommended for oat smut. The same treatment is even more effective than the ordinary blue-stone treatment for the stinking smut in wheat. The loose smut of wheat can be prevented by a modified hot water treatment coupled with separate growth of seed in a protected seed plot. Director C. H. Williams, West Raleigh, N. C., states that these diseases cause thousands upon thousands of dollars lost every year to the oat and wheat crops of the State and that this bulletin was prepared especially to give farmers at this time the latest and most effective means of combating these diseases. He states that a copy of this bulletin may be secured by any resident of North Carolina free of cost upon application to him.
