Plans For Foreign Service.

Washington, Jan. 13-The recognition of special efficiency for diplomatic service is to be made certain under a bill introduced today by Representative Lowden, of Illinois, and understood to have the approval of Secretary of State Knox.

The bill seeks to establish the merit system more firmly throughout the State Department and the diplomatic and consular service, and to provide for the transfer of trained men from the State Department to the foreign service of the United States. An efficiency roll is to be established, the work of em-ployes carefully followed, and their records kept. From this merit, list it is proposed to pick men for the secretary-ships in the diplomatic service and for the consular service.
