YEA, YEA AND NAY, NAY.
 Simple language, in the way of words of one or two syllables, has ever been held as the highest class. Volubility, either in long, high sounding words, or in words profane, carries no weight or force with the intelligent.
 And yet there is a great deal of cheap notoriety gained by employing words that are neither simple or rightly expressive of the subject at issue. Note the conversation of the illiterate. It is a language that falls into common errors because the speaker does not know the meaning of the words. The educated person may know well the meaning and bearing in its sentence construction of each word spoken, and yet only the simpler words will be used.
 In public life, there is the flippancy of expression, in slang expressions, or the indecency in profanity, that may temporarily catch the popular laugh, or the applause, but there is no sustaining power, in using such language. A congressman gained cheap applause and secured fame for the minute in the newspaper scare head, when he declared a few days ago in Congress, that the postoffice department was "in a h— of a fix!" How often in the public speeches does the name of the Creator come in, to reinforce some statement, and yet if the speaker but knew it, his speech was so much the weaker because of his really sacrilegious utterance.
 It is not that the use of profanity by men in high places is wrong in itself, but more in its tendency to corrupt the youth, to in a degree inaugurate bad thoughts among the masses. It is a serious matter, this making common use of the name of the Almighty, and even those who do so, know full well the harm in such language. It is a long way to go back, nearly twenty centuries, and yet how truly applicable today the words of the Master, who found in "yea" and "nay" the full power and strength for all affirmation or negation in every day conversation.
