EXTRA SESSION SEEMS ASSURED

Situation Affords Opportunity For Senators To Get In Some "Underground" Work

Washington, Feb. 24.—On leaving the White House and after a talk with President Taft, Senator Clapp, of Minnesota, expressed the opinion that an extra session of Congress could not now be avoided, owing to the crowded condition of things in the Senate, the opposition to certain measures and lack of time for the proper consideration of important measures that a number of Senators insist shall not be rushed through without proper investigation.

The statement is going the rounds that Senator La Follette is protesting loudly against the passage in the House in a single day of three appropriation bills.

The Wisconsin insurgent is said to have served notice that these measures must not only be carefully considered by Senate committees before they are reported, but he and his political associates intend that they shall be looked into carefully and discussed after the bills are taken up in the Senate.

Altogether the situation affords ample opportunity for certain Senators to get in what is called in legislative circles "underground" work—they can do it by matters and score without appearing to unnecessarily delay progress of bills and agreements favored by the Taft Administration.

TRAINING SCHOOL FOR NEGROES

House Committee Decides to Report Favorably on Appropriating \$5,000 For It.

Raleigh, Feb. 24.—The House Committee on penal institutions decided to report favorably the bill appropriating five thousand dollars for the establishment of a reformatory and training school for negroes, to be located near Charlotte.

Democrats of the joint committees on Congressional apportionment have decided to transfer Catawba county from the 9th to the 8th district and Wilkes from the 8th to the 7th. Hoke county was placed in the 7th and Avery county in the 9th. There was a heated discussion over the changes. Senator Leonard, of Union county, objecting to Wilkes being transferred to the 7th, but the committee concluded that this was the best solution of the problem in order to make all the districts safely Democratic.

The Senate voted to increase the expense allowance of the superior court judges from \$250 to \$750, in addition to the \$3,250 salaries, and also to increase the salaries of the superior court judges to \$4,000 instead of \$3,500, as now. Many new bills were introduced, including one by Senator Brown to increase the area of Hoke county by taking additional territory from Robeson.

Senator Ivis introduced a bill to prevent insurance companies from expending extravagant sums in competition for new business.

The House received favorable reports on bills to make the pay of the supreme court reporter \$1,500 and the supreme court justice \$4,500. A bill to safeguard the interest of the state in thrupicks and railroads through convict labor, the bill carrying an appropriation of \$3,500.

The Senate passed on second-reading a lengthy argument the bill increasing the pension fund for old soldiers from \$450,000 to \$704,000.

Representative Williams, of Buncombe, presented the reduction of the tax on agents for pianos and organs, from \$100 to \$50 with a provision that will prevent duplicate licenses for agencies.

Judge Ewart tried to get through amendments to section 71 as to cigarettes, increasing the license tax on the dealers gradually so that increase be from \$250 to \$500 minimum, up to \$2,500. Carr, of Durham, Connor and others opposed this and the amendment was lost. To retail, license tax was left at \$5 and the section adopted. On amendment to increase the tax on cigarette manufacturers was adopted, making the tax \$2,000 instead of \$1,900, the vote being 34 to 25.

Section 75 was amended so as to exempt ex-Confederate soldiers from license taxes for peddling eye glasses.

Torpedo Fleet Will Practice.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 24.—Plans for the spring and summer practice of the Atlantic torpedo fleet have been announced by the Navy Department. During March, April and May the first and third submarine divisions, with the Castine and the Severn will conduct submarine exercises in Chesapeake Bay.

The vessels will leave the Norfolk navy yard for Solomon's Island, Md., on March 1. The entire Atlantic torpedo fleet will be concentrated in the vicinity of Tangier Island in the Chesapeake Bay about March 15 to witness the spouting practice to be carried out by the Atlantic fleet with the San Marcos, formerly the battleship Texas, as a target.

In May the destroyers of the Atlantic torpedo fleet will be called upon to operate under war conditions in exercises which will be completed later.

The third submarine division including the vessels of the first division were presently attached to the third, and the Severn and Castine will go to Cape Cod Bay to conduct operations with the Atlantic fleet in July and August.

COUNTRY GOUGED BY COFFEE TRUST

Entire Trade Controlled By One Group of Finance.

Washington, Feb. 24.—Charging that the general public is being gouged to the extent of \$35,000,000 a year by a huge international trust that controls the world's coffee supply. Representative George W. Norris, of Nebraska, yesterday introduced resolutions in the house calling upon the state department and the department of justice to advise congress what can be done to relieve the people of the United States.

Representative Norris said: "I find the coffee trade of the world is controlled by a group of international bankers of London, Brussels, Paris, Berlin and New York acting with the government of Brazil and the Brazilian state of Sao Paulo. This combination has been known to exist for a long time but only lately has its tremendous and universal power been known. Likewise my investigation has demonstrated to my satisfaction that extreme discrimination is being exerted against the United States simply because this country is thought to be able to stand the tax better than others and because we are the largest consumers of coffee."

Retail Merchants Perfect Organization

Wednesday night the retail merchants of this city completed the organization of the New Bern Branch of the Retail Merchants Association of North Carolina. Every business man in New Bern is vitally interested in this organization. Every member of the association, (and nearly every retail merchant is a member) has agreed to immediately give to the secretary a list with the names of every customer with his credit rating.

The name of every person who is now on the merchant's books will go to the secretary's office rated according to his standing with each individual merchant. This information will be kept on file in the secretary's office, and from it will be compiled a credit book which will immediately be placed into the hands of each merchant who is a member of this association. Thus any merchant at a single notice can tell the credit rating of any person who has had credit in New Bern.

There are other features. This organization is connected with the State and National Association. If a stranger comes to New Bern from any point where this association is represented, (there are 120 associations in N. C.) it will be a easy matter for the merchants to know his credit rating where he comes from. If a person leaves New Bern owing bills the accounts will be reported to the association at the city to which the former resided of New Bern has moved.

The merchants of New Bern will know "who is who" from now on.
