Exempted. Other Bills

Raleigh, March 4—The Turlington Anti-Trust bill came up for the final passage under special order. Mr. Turlington spoke for twenty minutes. He declared that the bill was prepared by one of the ablest lawyers and best of ficials of North Carolina and was in accord with the recommendations made by Governor Kitchin in his message to the Legislature, and was practically the law of 1907 with two sub-section I and F. 
