ORGANIZATION BY DEMOCRATS

Preparatory to Work of Special Session. Tariff, New States. Other Problems.

Washington, March 7.—Behind locks and bolts, the new Democrats Ways and Means Committee has taken up its serious labor. In its dual role as committee on committees and on ways and means, it begins outlining of the entire policy of the house of representatives of the next Congress.

The organization of the house and the setting of a definite legislative program, particularly as to tariff revision, are the big problems. Indications are that the committee will be in almost continuous session from now until it reports the first revision of a tariff schedule to the Democratic House in the extra session.

When the question of approving the constitution of New Mexico and Arizona comes up in the special session, and it will be pressed early and persistently, Senators say, there will probably be a new alignment among the Democrats who voted almost solidly for the approval of the Arizona constitution. Friends of the territory believe that the new men coming into the next Congress, as a rule, will be favorable to Statehood, and that both Territories will be admitted, probably in the special session.

It was pointed out by constitutional authorities here that in case the Senate and House disagree as to the time of adjournment of the coming extra session, President Taft has the power to terminate it.

If both houses passed the Canadian Reciprocity bill, for instance, the Republican senate might purposely disagree with the Democratic House in order to prevent tariff revision and give the President a chance to take advantage of his constitutional prerogative.

The Democrats, however, are aware of this pitfall, and it is understood that they will hold up reciprocity as long as they wish to remain in session.

AVIATION MEET BEGINS THURSDAY

Thousands of Visitors Through Wilmington. A Gala Week.

Wilmington, N. C., March 7.—Representatives of the Curtiss Exhibition Company arrived in the city yesterday with two bi-planes which will be used during the meet to be held here Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week. The machines have been put in place on the grounds of the Wilmington Driving Association, a short distance east of the city and where the flights will take place. The scene at the ground resembles every preparation being made for a fair, for different attractions for the tents have arrived and pitched their ways. Quite a number of exhibits will be placed within the grounds and special attention will be given to agricultural implements and automobiles.

All of the railroads leading into Wilmington have given reduced rates and it is expected that thousands of visitors will be here. Boat excursions will run to the city for the meet. While many visitors expected Wednesday night and Thursday, the bulk of the crowd will be here Friday and Saturday.

As has been stated before, several of the best known aviators in America will operate the machines. The trial that will probably be here will be McCurdy Fly and Beachy, the first two of which have attained world wide reputations, one by his flight across the Florida straits and the other by a flight from a battleship near Norfolk to land. The Tidewater Power Company will operate cars to the grounds every few minutes. Where the meet is to be held is on the electric line to Wrightsville Beach and many will probably take advantage of the opportunity to visit the beach during the winter season.

CLUBS MAY RETAIN LOCKERS

Soldiers Home Receives Appropriation of \$30,000. Other Bills Passed.

Raleigh, March 6.—The Senate passed the House bill to adjust the boundary lines between Washington and Chowan counties, making the line the middle of Albemarle sound. This is for an adjustment of the litigation involving the taxes on the Norfolk and Southern bridge across the sound.

The bill to prohibit the handling of intoxicating liquors by clubs or associations provoked a lively debate.

Senator McLaughlin, chairman of the committee on propositions and grievances, reported that his committee had prepared a substitute for the Brown bill, which, he said, was deemed too drastic.

Senator Boyden made a vigorous protest against any more legislation along this line, declaring that his position was well known and that he was convinced that the prohibition law of North Carolina was a complete farce and a failure. He moved to postpone any action.

The Senate passed a committee substitute bill for the Brown bill against liquor, the provisions being practically the same as the amended Latham bill that passed the House and which does not interfere with individual members of regular social and commercial clubs having liquors in personal lockers.

The House refused to concur in the Senate amendment to the appropriation from \$30,000 to \$40,000 and the Senate receded. The House also provided a conference committee on the Senate amendment as to the revenue bill.

Senate amendments were concurred in for charter of Spencer; provide annual husbandry building for A. & M. College; and bills passed to increase the salary of the commissioner of labor; provide for State central highway from Beaufort Harbor to Tennessee line; protect claims in the waters of North Carolina; allow commissioners of counties in this State to make appropriations for road improvement demonstrations; regulate shipment of cattle into North Carolina; require prompt service by telegraph companies; incorporate the Raleigh, Charlotte and Southern Railway Co.; allow married women to contract as feme soles, and make conveyance by complying with section 8 of the constitution; provide for the payment of reward for Lewis West, the murderer of deputy sheriff Mumford, of Wilson.

St. Petersburg, March 7.—Ninety persons, mostly children, were burned and trampled to death in a fire that destroyed a moving picture theater at Belongue. Forty persons were injured, many seriously.

The theater was an old building and caught fire from the picture machine. Five hundred persons were in the building and they immediately made a dash for the narrow doors of the theater.

All night long escaped but were being preserved, but the walls were being slugged by the fire. The men in attendance had seen the women and children, their screams being heard as they perished.
