School Vaccination Notice.

At a meeting of the Board of Trustees of the New Bern Graded Schools, held on Friday March 17, 1911, the following resolution was passed.

"Whereas from the report and recommendation of Dr. J. F. Rhem, Superintendent of Health of Craven County, in the judgment of this Board general vaccination of teachers and children attending the schools is desired and required for the public safety. Now, therefore, be it.

"Resolved. That no teacher or pupil be allowed to attend any school of the city of New Bern, after, April 1, 1911, who does not present to the principal of such school a certificate of a physician of the city, showing that such teacher or pupil has been successfully vaccinated within three years from that time, unless such person has been vaccinated within ten days preceding the date he or she presents himself or herself for such attendance, and this resolution shall be a permanent regulation of the schools."

This regulation applies to both the white and colored schools and all pupils are urged to comply with the conditions as soon as possible. Certificates for this purpose will be prepared at once and on and after April 1st, no pupil will be admitted to school who has not complied with this resolution.
