IS IT FAIR OR DEMOCRATIC?

"Maybe Senator Simmons thought any man whom the lumber trust and the other big interests thought it worth while to spend \$100,000 in order to insure his election must necessarily be the 'peer of any man in the senate.'"

"If Senator Simmons makes another Lorimer speech and votes against reciprocity once more he will not even be counted as a candidate in North Carolina."

The above editorial paragraphs from the Raleigh Times, April 9th, are not merely unfair, they do rank injustice to North Carolina's Senior Senator. No political opponent could have used language implying not simply criticism, but worse, insinuations against the public character of Senator Simmons, than has the Times. There is no political campaign now on in North Carolina, over the senatorship. There is not even a public declaration from any would be candidate for the nomination that is still many months away. Yet the Times constitutes itself jury, judge and executioner, without accepting the fact that the law demands the offender shall have a fair trial before a jury of his peers.

The question of Senator Simmons' vote on the Lorimer matter in the Senate is one of personal judgment, as a juror finds the testimony in a case. Mr. Simmons has made his reasons public, and he is not likely to change his attitude on this Lorimer issue, or on reciprocity, the latter also being publicly explained, tho' any Democrat, any person favoring square tariff dealing, would take the same position, as does Senator Simmons, on this Taft reciprocity bill. That North Carolina's senior Senator is thoroughly honest in both his vote on the Lorimer issue and his public position on reciprocity, is plainly to be seen. On both he might have "sneaked" aside from his convictions and gained an applause that would have meant nothing, because his applauders knew nothing of the inside of the question the Senator had to decide upon.

There may be those who will differ with Senator Simmons, but no fair minded person, no sincere Democrat will read him out of the party as a possible future Senatorial candidate, because, as a United States Senator, having an opinion, he votes this opinion, after wards making public in perfect candor his reasons for so voting, though by so voting there may appear danger threatening his own political future.

CONVENTIONS IN MUSIC.

Rules Which Song Composers Seem to Follow. Why is it that all our musicians in writing a national song invariably use a portion of the best known scraps of music as the introduction, "vamp," or counter-melody? Why do the open fifth in the bass always appear in rustic songs? Because it can't be helped, it seems. Our popular Irish songs always have a bar or two of a well known old Irish melody or a Greek bass, otherwise they wouldn't be Irish. The exhausted old Tommy and his partner, the straw, come to the rescue of every "rustic" song or piece that is perpetrated, and our national air must run all through the accompaniment of patriotic songs to give them "flavor."

Because all of these things are "set" they are conventions. Why must every song end on the tonic note, with the preceding tone either the second or seventh of the scale, unless we expect the detestable third of the hollow fifth? Because our audiences expect it.

Should one of your composers in a moment of bravado or recklessness produce a score in which he disregarded these many conventions his first night hearers would go away remarking that the music was crazy. They do not realize that they expect to hear the same old thing, served up a trifle differently, of course, but still the same. "Where Have I Heard That Tune Before?" in Metropolitan Magazine.
