PREPARING TO FLEE MEXICO

Way Laid Out For President to Escape To The Atlantic Coast.

Washington, April 12—Confidential reports received at the War College from the United States Army officers in Mexico show that President Diaz has laid careful and complete plans to escape from his country.

Only two regiments remain in Mexico City. The other troops, which were stationed in the capital together with several additional picked regiments, have been detailed to a territory where there are practically no insurrectionists in such a manner that they form an avenue leading direct from Mexico City to the Atlantic coast.

It has become known that Mexico is literally honeycombed with confidential agents from the War Department. Many of them are army officers. Reports are made on every move of troops and the information is marked down on a huge map in the War College, pins with colored heads representing companies of regiments.

The latest move of President Diaz is chronicled with a line of pins leading direct from Mexico City to the Atlantic coast.

SECOND NIAGARA IN GEORGIA

South's Largest Power Plant At Ocmulgee River Dam.

Jackson, Ga., April 11—What the great Roosevelt dam is to the West, the Niagara power plant to the region around the Great Lakes, the Ocmulgee river dam, eight miles from Jackson, is to Georgia and the South.

This immense power plant has recently been completed after more than two years of work, during which time a large force of hands has been kept busy night and day.

This is the largest power plant of the kind in the South, though the Tallulah Falls development will be larger when it is completed.

One of the uses for the power will be for running the Atlanta-Macon, Macon-to-Albany interurban line. This line is an assured fact, and, without some unforeseen hitch, dirt will be broken on the line within the next 60 or 90 days. It will be one of the longest lines of the kind in the South, and will open up one of the richest sections of the State, placing Middle Georgia at a distance of well over a hundred miles. The electric current from the Ocmulgee dam will be used in operating the system.

FOR RECORDER'S COURT

SOME FIGURES FOR CRAVEN CO. VOTERS.

The opponents of the Recorder's Court have been handing out some figures that have been doped up to suit their side of the case. Here, however, are some figures that can be verified by Mr. Groves, the county Auditor.

Last year the total amount of fees paid the jurors in criminal courts was \$2,617.50. Feeding prisoners in the jail, 1,137.68. Making a total of \$3,755.18.

In counties where the Recorder's Courts have been established, the county jail has been practically free from prisoners, and the same state would exist in Craven county with a Recorder's Court. Thus it can be readily seen that over a thousand dollars would be saved on the item of feeding the prisoners alone. This cannot be disputed.

The total amount paid to jurors in criminal courts for 1910 was \$2,017.50. In every one of these courts it took one solid week to clean up the docket, in fact, the docket was never cleaned up for the Governor had to call a special criminal term last year. In counties where it took one week to clean up the docket, before the establishment of the Recorder's Court, now busy in two days with rare exceptions. If this fact and Craven county had a Recorder's Court last year, the jurors instead of being paid \$2,017.50, would have been paid \$2,000.00, or at least a thousand dollars saved.

Recorder's Court.

The above figures would be an absolute saving to Craven county, and no intelligent man can dispute this fact. On the other hand, the Recorder's Court in other towns and counties where it is now established, is self-sustaining; is not only self-sustaining, but pays into the town and county treasury a large sum of money each year. The Recorder's Court for New Bern and Craven counties would not only pay for all the officers of the court, save the county a few thousand dollars as stated above, but would pay into both treasuries a sum of money that would lighten the heart of every taxpayer.

FEES MORE THAN AMPLE.

A letter from the firm of Manly, Hendon & Wrenn, of Winston-Salem, N. C., dated: "Since its establishment in 1907, this court has proven entirely satisfactory in every way. It has relieved our superior court of a much criminal work that we have reduced the length of our criminal term. I suppose it depends on the merits of the crimes committed in the county. As a result of this the county has been relieved of a tremendous amount of cost.

When a criminal is brought to the court he carries an entire amount. Some times ago I had the results in Craven county this year of 100 cases, and I found that the fees paid to the jury amounted to more than enough to pay all the salaries of the officers of the court and the expenses of the entire term of the year.
