As the cars proceeds on their journey westward, the inspiration promises to increase, so that when the trip is completed, when each county learns what it must do, it will only need the word "go," to start road building in each county, so that the prob ability is that 30 days from July 4th, next, will see the Central Highway a reality. Cath county will make good its own roads join ing the next county, so that when the month is ended, as the men in every county rise up from their labors at the county lines, there will stretch out throughout North Carolina, this splendid highway, ready for the public use. Now is the time for each county, within itself, to prepare to enter the race for the 30 days completion of this highway within its territory and so have the entire highway ready at the

Mock suns are similar in point of rigin to the mirages of the desert. only they occur in the arctic circle. As the long winter night of the polar region wanes once every twenty-four hours a slight glow is seen at some point on the horizon. Often accompa-nying this glow is seen the phenomenon of the meck suns. Several degrees up in the heavens as many as five of these spectral orbs have been seen at one time. Invariably they are all connected in a geometric figure, the suns seemingly bound together with circles and arcs of light. Often when only one appears it is mistaken for the real god of day, and natives rejoice at the early end of the long winter night only to be disappointed as the image disappears. The explanation of the phenomenon is given by physicists as refraction and reflection of light from the real sun below the horizon on the mists in the upper at-mosphere.—St. Louis Republic.
