He came here with Burnside in March 1863, and after recovering from a wound received while passing the blockade, a little ways down the Neuse, he was given employment in the provost marshal's office. During this period he organized the New Bern Fire Department.

Col. Neson was appointed postmaster in June 1865, and held that position nine years.
