President Taft's refusal to grant clemency in favor of the two bank ers Walsh and Morse, now serving terms in the penitentiary for mis appropriating the funds of their banks, has excited national interest. The prominence of the two offenders, and their daring acts, together with their trials and sen tences, make their cases in all details familiar public history.
