WILEY WILL NOT BE FIRED

Secretary Wilson Wants Him To Be Admonished But Not Dismissed.

Washington, D. C. July 27.—Secretary of Agriculture Wilson in a report to President Taft has recommended that Dr. Harvey W. Wiley, the pure food expert, be admonished, but not dismissed. Secretary Wilson, it is understood declares leniency must be shown Dr. Wiley because of his valued services to the government in the past and his usefulness for the future.

Under the recommendation the President will be able to retain Dr. Wiley in his position, as it has been believed all the time he would do, without agreeing to ignore the advice of his Attorney General. Thus an embarrassing situation will be avoided.

From what is learned, it appears that the secretary upholds the charge of the committee that Dr. Wiley committed a grave error and violated the law, but suggests that in view of the doctor's splendid work in the past and his value to the department he should be admonished and retained in the service. There has been no intimation as to when President Taft will announce his decision and make public the papers in the case.

Protests against the proposed dismissal of Dr. Wiley have been pouring in from all parts of the country. It is charged that interests whose activities have been interfered with by the pure food champion sought this means to get rid of him.

An investigation of the case has been ordered by the House and will begin soon, whatever may be the final decision of the President.

Expensive Resurrection.

Washington, July 27.—Congress will shortly be asked by the War Department to appropriate \$250,000 more to complete the work of raising the battleship Maine in Havana harbor. This will make a total expenditure of \$900,000.

CRIMINAL PROSECUTION DEMANDED

Ohio Senator Asks That Attorney General Criminally Prosecute Trust Officials.

Washington, July 27.—Senator Foraker, of Ohio, called up before the Senate his resolution to prosecute criminally the officers of the Standard Oil and American Tobacco Companies, for alleged persistent violation of the anti-trust law.

"The American people," said he, "cannot understand why there should be no criminal prosecutions against these defendants, when the government is so vigorous in its prosecution of minor offenders."

DISASTROUS FIRE AT WASHINGTON

Loss Estimated At \$30,000. Started In Printing Office. About \$10,000 Insurance.

Washington, N. C. July 27 At an early hour this morning one of the most disastrous fires in several years was discovered in the press room of the Tidewater Printing Company. This company was located right in the Morton building right in the business district of the city and despite the heroic efforts of the fire company it was soon seen that the entire building was doomed to destruction.

The flames had gained considerable headway before they were discovered and within an hour's time the entire building had been gutted and only the outside walls were left standing.

The building was owned by Messrs Charles L. Morton and was occupied by the W. B. Morton Furniture Co., the Tidewater Printing Co. W. M. Kear Real Estate Co. and Dr. L. H. Mann dentist. The property valued, as nearly as can be ascertained, was about \$30,000 and the insurance only about \$10,000.

James Redmond was born in Ireland about 70 years ago. At an early age he came to New York City, and witnessed some of the stirring scenes in that metropolis about the Legation of the civil war. About the close of the war he sailed for Beaufort, N. C. remaining there a short time, then coming to New Bern, going then to Pollockville and after engaging there in merchandizing for a short time, returned to this city where he engaged in active business, suffering reverses but finally securing a competence that made him independent of all work during his later years.

He was a prominent Mason and Odd Fellow, belonging to several local lodges, also treasurer of B. P. O. E. Lodge, an honorary member A. S. F. E. Co.

Without any family or kin, Mr. Redmond has made his home for years, with Mr. T. A. Green and family where he enjoyed the most comfortable surrounding and companionship. A man of quiet manner, Mr. Redmond was generous and public spirited, foremost in liberal contributions to church and charity, and ever ready to help deserving young men. Sincere and steadfast to those he deemed worthy, his help and influence was ever at their service. In the various organizations in which he was identified, on the street where he made his daily walk, James Redmond will be missed.

The funeral services will be held at Centenary Methodist Church Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock, also Masonic burial services. The remains will arrive here at 12:30 a. m. tonight.
