While the members of par-fument are bis majesty's "faithful commons," they have certain privi-ieges which he binneelf does not pos-sees. Thus King George can summon or proregue parliament at will, but he cannot prolong it buyond a definite period. Similarly be is athelitely de-barred from imposing any sort of tar-ation whatever without first securing the consent of parliament. Be jeek ously gnarded is this privilege that a king cannot create new officers with new fees or annex new fees to activit to trygons times, however, when an fugital momarch was in want of famile be vouid levy taxes right and left and without asking snybody. 
