Exhibit Contains Many Rare Animals.

In the Mighty Haug Shows Mammoth Zoological collection which exhibits at New Bern on Sept, 27th will be found one of the rarest forms of animal life ever before coming to the notice of man. This rare specie of animal is called "Hippotragua Equinius" and is the only living one in America today, having been captured by an English war correspondent during the war be-

tween the Boers and England.

The "Hipporragua Equaus" is the female gender and is known to the Hoers as a specie of Gemsbok that are today extinct. The female is the largest of the two being 45 feet at the withers and the ears are very large, while the mans is small and erect and the horns seldom exceed 36 inches.
