The holy day is mentioned in the Bible in a number of places; Leviticus xv describes the claborate priestly ceremo nial of atonement; ibid xxiii, 26-32, it appears in the list of festivals where the "affliction of the soul" (fasting) is ordained; ibid xxv, 9 announces that on the Day of Atonement, each fiftieth year, the trumpet sound shall usher in the jubiles year; while Numbers xxix, 7-11 describes the sacrifices of this sacred day. From these references and later accounts in the Talmui we can get a picture of this Day of Awe as it was celebrated in Biblical times. The holy day on the tenth day of Tishri was observed by abstention from food and drink and by an elaborate ceremonial in which the high priest was the central figure. He besought forgiveness for his own sins and those of his own house hold, then for those of the wider household of priests, then for all the people. Of two goats, he slaughtered one as a sacrifice "for the Lord" and set the other aside "for Azazel." The blood of the sacrifices he sprinkled upon the curtain of the Holy of Holies, to purify it from the sins of the people.
