New York, Nov. 4 - Cotton has been irregular under the sway of conflicting influences, now of big receigts and increasing estimates of the size of the crop, and now of killing frost, manipulation of December with talk of a possible squeeze of the shorts in that month and some pretty plain indications that in the neighborhood of nine cente, spin-ners are disposed to buy freely.
