## GRAVEN COUNTY TEACHERS MEET

Held First Meeting of the Present Term at the Court House Yesterday Morning.

Yesterday morning the Craven County Teacher's Association held its first meeting of the present term at the court house in this city. There were about forty members present, and considerable business was transacted. Among other things, officers for the year were elected and new work was outlined. Owing to the fact that pressing business engagements compelled many of the teachers to be absent, the attendance would have been larger but those who were in attendance were very enthusiastic and went into the work before them with a vim not heretofore exhibited.

The meeting was opened by County Superintendent S. M. Brinson, who outlined the work of the year. He then called for nominations for president, and Prof. C. A. Everett, of Dover, J. B. Paul, of Cove City and N. L. Gaskins, of Bridgeton, were placed in nomination. A ballot was taken and Mr. Everett was elected to that position. Mr. J. B. Paul, of Bridgeton, was elected vice-president, and Miss Carrie Hardison, of Thurman, Secretary-treasurer.

Prof. Craven, of the local graded schools, made an interesting talk on the Boston school system, giving interesting and instructive points gained during his recent visit and inspection of the schools in that city.

Prof. C. A. Everett, President of the Association, delivered an interesting address on "The Relation of the Teacher to the Community."

The important matter of grading was discussed by Mr. M. A. Hill and others. The County Treasurer, Mr. B. B. Hurst very kindly treated the teachers to a splendid assortment of fruit and received from them a rising vote of thanks.

The Association adjourned to meet at the court house the first Saturday in December.

## WEEKLY REVIEW COTTON SITUATION

Indicates Nine Cents Besting Low Point. European Demand. Southern Markets Firmer.

New York, Nov. 4.—Cotton has been irregular under the sway of conflicting influences, now of big receipts and increasing estimates of the size of the crop, and now of killing frost, manipulation of December with talk of a possible squeeze of the shorts in that month and some pretty plain indications that in the neighborhood of nine cents, spinners are disposed to buy freely. The Governors' meeting at New Orleans had some effect though it has not been marked. Nor has the rumor that European bankers may finance 2,000,000 bales been taken very seriously nor the estimate from the New Orleans convention of 13,710,000 bales as the world's consumption of American cotton. But growing evidence of a restiveness of Southern farmers under the continued decline in prices which has sent quotations of some months well below the 9 cent level and of an increasing disposition in some sections of the belt to hold back cotton, have certainly not been without some effect.

Southern spot markets have lately been firmer with a good European demand reported at some interior points at which the basis is noticeably better than it was recently. Spinners have bought more freely. Continental spinners have been buying here some large spot houses have been good buyers. Liverpool's daily spot sales have lately doubled. Shorts, big and little, have become uneasy under the res stance met to a further decline after the price had broken through nine cents to a new low level and have lately covered freely. These include Waldorf-Astoria interests and other identified with the short side. Wall street houses have bought for both sides of the account, Southern and Fall River mills are running on full jime. The drift of things in the dry goods trade is towards improvement. Stocks of dry goods, in the hands of distributors are 30 per cent smaller than last year.

The woolen industry is wakening up. A severe freeze has lately threatened important tracts of the belt in the southwest and elsewhere. There will be little top crop. On the other hand the receipts have been at times enormous and spot houses in control of the December option have been quietly selling in and buying latter months. It is contended that 75 per cent of the crop has been picked and that frost can do comparatively little harm as the rest is open. Much of the time the weather has been reported very favorable for picking and marketing. Manchester has been dull, feeling the effects of the news from China. Unsettlement in that country is feared, may have a bad effect on trade and China is next to the largest of Manchester's customers. Those who believe in lower prices insist that the law of supply and demand and not governors' convention must fix the price and that artificial interference with the normal course of trade is likely in the end to do more harm rather than good. However, this may be the undertone, of late it has been stealer. The spinner is less afraid to buy than he was awhile back. The market shows more resistance around the nine-cent level in spite of the big ginning figures. Liverpool reports that China is sending very few cancellations of orders. Covering of shorts here and buying by big trade interests have neutralized the effect of the weight of the crop.

November export engagements are said to be large.

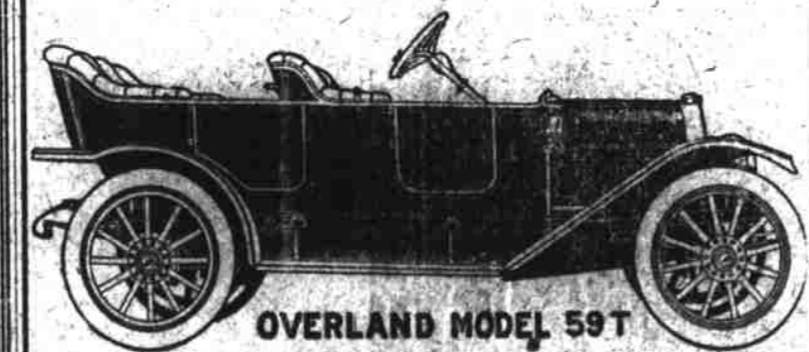
