## PRESIDENT FINLEY OF SOUTHERN

Railway Gives Opinion on Currency Legislation as Available Make Banking Local.

Washington, Nov. 9th—Speaking of the present discussion of currency legislation, President Finley, of the Southern Railway Company, said:

"The banks of the Southern States compare very favorably as to soundness and ability of management with those of any other part of the country. This was demonstrated in the panic of 1907 and the subsequent business depression.

"In the South, as in the West, a much larger supply of currency is needed during the crop-moving period than at any other time in the year. The effect of the present banking system is that, during this crop-moving season and as a result of this large demand for cash interest rates tend to advance and credit is curtailed, notwithstanding the fact that the farmers of the South are bringing to market hundreds of millions of dollars worth of cotton and other products, on the basis of which credit should expand rather than contract.

"Speaking generally, therefore, any plan of currency legislation should not only be such as will stand the strain of conditions tending to create panics, but should also be so framed as to meet peculiar sectional requirements. This does not mean that legislation should be sectional, for any plan that will enable the banks of the South, or of any other locality, to meet the seasonal demands for cash and to expand their credit within safe limits will be beneficial to the entire country.

"It is, I believe, to the interest of the entire country, as well as of the South, that the banking resources of each locality should be made available for commercial transactions in that locality, as far as this can be done consistently with safety and sound banking. In its own operations the Southern Railway Company aims to aid in the carrying out of this policy. So far as it can consistently do so, it allows the money it receives in payment for freight and passenger transportation to remain in the localities in which it is collected, in the shape of deposits in local banks, to be drawn upon from time to time as occasion may require in payment of wages and other obligations."

## STEEL TRUST FAVORS FOREIGN

Labor. Sells Rails Cheaper Abroad. Have Two Sets Freight Rates.

Washington, Nov. 9—The Stanley committee, which is investigating the United States Steel Corporation, has positive evidence that American railroads have to pay about \$10 a ton more for rails than foreign roads do. This fact will be brought out when the committee resumes its hearing Nov. 21.

Rails made by the Bessemer process sell for \$28 here and \$20 abroad. Open hearth rails vary in price ranging from \$29 to \$31.50, but the foreigner gets a much better rate than the domestic customer.

The price of the Bessemer rail is fixed by the Steel Trust by interlocking directors. The Stanley committee will prove this also.

Two sets of freight charges help the foreigner. An all-rail shipment to New York from Pittsburg goes at the rate of 16 cents a hundred. The same shipment, if it is on its way across the ocean, goes to New York for 10 cents a hundred, making a difference of \$1.20 a ton in favor of the foreign consumer. The domestic consumer pays the difference between \$38 and \$20 plus the difference in the charge for a ton of foreign-bound and a domestic shipment of freight.

The Stanley committee will show that the prices of billets, bars, rods and plates vary, but the prices of rails does not unless the Big Steel Corporation so wills it. Steel bars have varied several dollars a ton inside of six months.

The United States Steel Corporation, the Pennsylvania Company, the Cambria Steel Company, the Lackawanna Company, the Bethlehem Steel Company and the Colorado Steel and Iron Company are virtually the only makers of steel rails in this country. Other concerns remake rails—take a ninety-pound rail, for instance, and convert it into a lighter rail, but the companies named here are the real rail makers and they have interlocking directors.

The Stanley committee will go into the labor conditions at the Steel Trust plants. It will show that the American laborer has given as to the foreigner at the mines, the mills and the factories of the big corporation. Where natives worked before the day of the United States Steel Corporation, foreigners work now. The labor union man has been driven out of the employ of the Steel Trust. Evidence has been found to prove that the Steel Corporation has advertised for Rumanians and Servians, stating that they were preferred to Americans. Chairman Stanley and his assistants gathered these facts since Congress adjourned.


