The local fire companies were called out yesterday morning at an early hour by an alarm turned in at box 34. After a spectacular run by all of the companies they discovered that it was a false alarm. However, the visiting members of the N. C. Fire Prevention Association were given an exhibition of how quick the local companies can arrive on the scene after the alarm has been turned up.

Yesterday the Journal stated that the Norfolk-Southern Railway Company had placed an order with a large car manufacturing concern for one thousand freight cars. In addition to this it is learned that they have also placed an order for several large locomotives. Judging from present indications the Norfolk-Southern Railway Company bids fair to soon lead all the other routes in this State in many ways.
