RISING TO AN EMERGENCY.

Ever now and then the newspapers have accounts of some sensational acts done by men. These deeds are generally performed as part of the man's duty in his work or employment, acts that his duty calls him to do, and yet many men fail in an emergency not because they lack in courage, but rather they fail to grasp the tituation and act promptly.

Two notable emergency deeds recently carried to full and splendid results, were those of conductor Lee on the Twentieth Century Limited, and Express Messenger Trousdale on the railroad train in Texas.

Express Messenger Trousdale, whose train was held up by two bandits, himself covered by the "gun" of one, fooled his first man, shot and killed him, also the second bandit as he attempted to crawl into the express car, thus saving the train from pillage and his company from money loss. It is not to be presumed that the double killing was to his liking. The situation called for a quick emergency act, and the duty was to preserve what Trousdale was placed in charge of to fully protect. The shooting was an incident. It was a part necessary.


