NEWS FROM THE NATION'S CAPITAL

Remains of "Fiddling Bob" Are Tenderly Borne to His Late Kentucky Home.

Washington, Apr. 2.—Robert L. Taylor, senior U. S. senator from Tennessee—"Fiddling Bob"—to all the South—died here Sunday, unable to withstand the shock of an operation for gall stone performed last Thursday. Thousands of Tennesseans are expected to pay homage to the late Senator Taylor at the State capital at Nashville Wednesday.

Senator Taylor's family and committee of both houses of Congress accompanied the body in a special car on a train which left here Monday night.

Senator Overman was appointed as a member of the Senate committee to attend the funeral.

To relieve flood conditions in the Mississippi valley, Representative Ruskell, of Louisiana, introduced a bill to make an emergency appropriation of \$350,000. The money would be made available immediately and utilized in reconstruction and maintenance of government levees on the river.

Dispatches to the Department of State from the American embassy in Mexico City reported the insurrection movement in Puebla and Vera Cruz as gaining and said there was considerable alarm in Mexico City. Trains are being held up by zapata forces and other insurrection, and in one instance an engineer was killed. The recent action of this government in prohibiting exportations of arms to Mexico made Juarez useless to the insurgents for that purpose.

The Democratic wool bill passed the House, 189 to 92, with 20 progressive Republicans voting for it. Representative Tucker, of Colorado, who opposed it in debate and answered "present" on the roll call, and Representative Francis, of Ohio, who voted against it were the only Democrats who did not line up with the majority.

News has reached here of the death at Rockersville, Va., of Thomas Jennings, who was one of the biggest men in Virginia. He weighed between 400 and 500 pounds. His wife weighs a out one hundred pounds.

The body had to be removed from the bedroom to the porch for burial preparations. A special coffin had to be made for him. It was found that the coffin could not be taken through the door, and the funeral was held from the porch, where the body remained until buried.

JONES COUNTY MAN SUICIDES

His Love For Young Lady Not Reciprocated, Young Daniel Koonce Blows His Head Off With Shot Gun.

Suffering the poignant grief of unrequited love, Daniel Koonce, an 18 year old youth who lived near Trenton, in Jones county, Sunday afternoon between 4 and 5 o'clock ended his life by shooting the top of his head off with a shot gun.

Young Koonce's relatives had noticed that he was in a morbid condition for several days prior to the time he ended his life and thought that he was physically unwell. After his death a note found in his pocket stated that his act was caused by the fact that a young lady to whom he had been very attentive, had refused to return the affections bestowed upon her.
