Washington, May 8. - The House passed the Bulkly bill, providing for the coinage of one-half cent pieces and three-cent pieces. The bill provides that they shall be comed of 75 per cent copper and 25 per cent. of nickel.

All new one-cent pieces are to be made a trifle smaller than the present penny. Hereafter they are to be made from the same specifications proposed for the half-pennies and three cert contain 90 per cent. of copper and 10 In Hamption Roads the German fleet per cent. of nickel. 
