But the failure of New Bern to take advantage of its splendid wa er facilities is unforunste for all the towns that lie along the navigable portions of the Neuseand Trent rivers. Should New Bern, at the confluence of the rivers and only a short. distance from the inland canal and the ocean, utilize her water front, other communities, situated farther up the streams, would soon take advantage of water traffic and, in the long run an excellent service would be built up. Referring to our own river, it would be an excellent idea for those towns situated on the Neuse to form a "Neuse R ver Improvement Association" and see if we can't develop river navigation to the point that it will become an imp.itant factor in the growth of this sec-

"Neuse River Improvement Association" is all right as far as it would go, if each city was making the local fight to own some river front property for itself.
