Washington, May 30 -After devoting yesterday largely to the consideration of amendments to the iron and steel bill, the sense adjourned last night without reaching a final vote on that measure. There was prolonged and sharp controversy over an amendment by Senator Pomerene, L Stevens, H K Land, J A Patterson, of Ohio, to take machine tools from the free list, as the House provided and fix a duty of 20 per cept, on them. This was defeated by a vote of 18 to 43.

The successful unexpected fight for the repeal of the reciprocity law was inaugurated by Senator Gronna, who at first proposed the repeal of all the reciprocity law, except the second section which permits the free admission of print paper from Canada.

Senator Gal inger moved as an amen ment the repeal of the entire reciprocity law, including the paper provision, This suggestion was accepted by Mr. Gronna, who withdrew his own amendment in its favor. The affect of the success of the Gallinger amendment wou'd have been to restore the Payne Aldrich rate of \$3.75 per ton on print paper and Senator Cummins declared his unwillingness to go so far, He then proposed a rate of \$2 per ton on print rs, Daniel Fulcher, J S Miller, Mark paper, which Mr. Gallinger accepted. The notification that the United States intended to rend z yous the second squadren at Key Weas a precautionary measure for the pretection of American and foreign li-ein Cuba, should that government be u. able to do so, is deemed sufficient,
