A NEAR LYNCHING.

Belvidere, N. C., Aug. 7.—Ben Vann, a white man, same name being lynched at Hartford today, where he had been taken to jail, following the finding of the corpse of Oliver Layton, a 17 year old boy. Vann, who was in jail on another charge, is said to have confessed to shooting the boy three times and hiding the body in a remote section of woods. No motive could be discovered.

Vann was removed to Elizabeth City when a crowd threatened the jail. Permission was given the sheriff of Pasquotank to use the State Militia; and in the meantime Vann is being rushed to Raleigh by automobile.

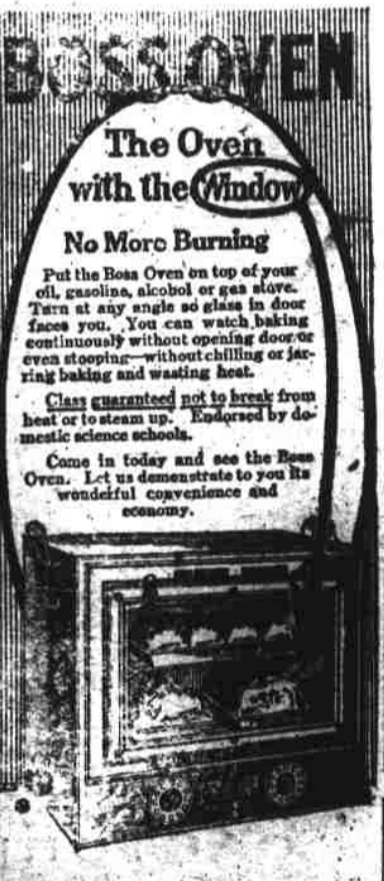
