In some places the water has stood in the fields for days and the farmers have been compelled to dig trenches in order to drain the fields. According to the statements of some of the largest land owners and farmers in that section the potato crop has been cut in half and unless the shippers receive exceptionally good prices for their product they will lose much money.
