

MILITARY MEN VISIT THE CITY

CONFER WITH COMMANDER C. D. BRADHAM ON IMPORTANT MATTERS.

Adjutant General L. W. Young of Raleigh and Inspector General Thomas Springfield of Waynesville were in the city yesterday conferring with Captain C. D. Bradham who is in command of the North Carolina Naval Militia in regard to the annual cruise of the Naval Reserves and the encampment of the Coast Artillery Corps.

Both gentlemen left yesterday afternoon for Morehead City and tomorrow will go to Camp Glenn and make arrangements for getting this place in readiness for the annual encampment. The grounds there will be put in first class condition and several new buildings will be erected before the soldier boys begin to arrive for their annual encampment.

In the past each division of the State's military companies has been under the supervision of division inspectors but in the future Inspector General Springfield will have them all under his charge and in this way will be able to keep more closely in touch with their condition.

INSURANCE OVERESTIMATED.

Only \$28,000 On News And Observer Plant.

Raleigh, N. C., April 26.—Instead of being forty or forty-five thousand, as was believed, the insurance on the building and plant of the News and Observer, which were destroyed by fire Thursday, amounted to only \$28,000, it was learned today. The loss is estimated at over \$65,000. Secretary of the Navy Daniels, president of the News and Observer Publishing Company arrived yesterday afternoon and at once began making plans for rebuilding.

TO HAVE MODERN ZOO.

Wealthy Man to Place Animals At Asheville.

Asheville, N. C., April 26.—Asheville is to have a modern zoo, by the latter part of the coming summer, Fred L. Seely, son-in-law of E. W. Grove, the St. Louis millionaire, who is the owner of a great deal of property here, having decided to establish zoological gardens on the Sunset mountains, which is owned by Mr. Grove. Mammoth concrete reservations have been built for the use of the animals, the first of which arrived yesterday afternoon when a pair of elk from Wyoming reached this city after spending eight days in an express car. One of the animals weighs 800 pounds and the other tips the scales at 500.
