WILMINGTON BUSILY PREPARING TO ENTERTAIN ASSOCIATION.

Wilmington is planning a big welcome to the hundreds of Elks who will pour into that city tomorrow and next day to attend the annual convention of the North Carolina Association of Elks. Yesterday's Wilmington Star says:

"Wilmington merchants, especially on Front street, began yesterday to decorate the fronts of their stores with bunting and flags for the annual meeting of the Elks of the State, which will be held Thursday and Friday of this week. Bunting in the colors of the order, purple and white, is being used.

"Arrangements for the big parade to be held on Friday morning are practically complete. The committee announced last night that the automobiles to be used in the automobile trip would not be decorated as was first planned. The plans have been changed in another particular. Instead of disembarking from the cars at Wrightsville Sound, it has been decided to return to Front and Princess, where the party will board the trolley cars for the beach.
