OFFICE OF CITY CLERK, NEW BERNE, Jan. 16, 1883, A Special Meeting of the Board of City Council was held this evening, Mayor Howard pre-

The following was adopted as a special quarantine ordinance:

WHEREAS, Information has reached the Mayor that certain cities north of us are infected with small-pox, and WHEREAS, We feel it our duty to devise such means as we think best to prevent the

Any violation of this ordinance shall subject the Railroad Company to a fine of \$25 for each and every offence.
