Last summer when Mr. Cushing went East with the Zunis, he mar-ried a young lady at Washington, to whom he had long been engaged, and brought her back a bride to live in an Indian hovel.

He was compelled to join the

tribe in order to pursue his researches, for the Zunis are a secre-tive people, and their religion and traditions are as secret as Masonry. After joining them the leading men of the tribe endeavored to persuade him to marry one of the dusky maidens who sit around half naked in the sun, mold pettery, and weave blankets. And he came near losing his influence with the Indians and even stood in danger of his life because of his refusal to do so.

Twice were women selected for him, utb he risked the penalty of reject-ing them, and would have fared badly but for the protection of the native govenor, who had adopted him into his family and give him a bed of sheep-skins in his rude home. Cushing told the Indians of his

engagement to a young lady in Washington, and of his intention to marry her and bring her to live with them, and although their preference would have been for him to take a wife from the tribe, their gallantry overcame their prejudice, and they received the pale face, brown-eyed bride with a respectful and cordial welcome.

Mrs. Cushing was the daughter of the late Mr. Magill, who was for many years connected with the venerable banking house of Lewis Johnson & Co., of washington, and was one of the belles of the capital. Her devotion to her husband runs parallel to his devotion to science, for there are few girls who would leave a beautiful home at Washington for a mud hut in an Indian pueblo, even for the men they

She hates the dirty women and naked children, and despises their filthy ways but she has made her mud hut a pretty little paradise, and has developed the possibility of comfort even in Zuni.

The clay walls of her rude house are hung with blankets woven by the Zunis and Navajo Indians, and compare in briliancy of color, texture, and design with the far-famed Gobelin tapestries. The ceilings of the undressed tranks of trees are covered with bright figured cretons and Japanese silk. The mud floor is strewn with sheep skins, tanned by the Indians, that are softer to the slippered foot than the rugs of Oriental magnificence, and ornaments selected with refined taste or Haynes' Excelsion American Guitars, framed with clever hands after the models of decorative art and hung here and fastened there, and strewn every where. The Cushing residence is a mud hut without, but within a bower of beauty.
