North Carolina Exhibit.
The day for the opening of the Manufacturers' and Mechanics' Fair at Boston, viz., the 5th of September, is near at hand, and the officers of the Department who were charged with the preparation of the North Carolina exhibit are glad to announce that their work is completed. All the material has been sent forward, and is now being arranged in the Exposition Building.

By those to whom this work was committed it was regarded as a high trust. It was felt by them that in all the history of the State it was the first time that adequate means were at disposal to set her in her just proportions before the world. With the means at command in former exhibits only partial success was possible. Then, too, the department had to rely mainly on voluntary contributions. Now it could be accomplished with its own resources. This of itself created a strong sense of responsibility, which was further stimulated to the highest degree by the reflection that the result would probably have no inconsiderable influence upon the future of the State. It was felt that in a most important regard, her reputation was, for the time, in their keeping.

Under the influence of these considerations it was determined to undertake and prosecute the work in such a manner as to exclude, if that could be done, all possibility of failure. The State in all her interests had long been the subject of study. Whatever publications could throw light on her resources in any way, whether upon or beneath the soil, had been diligently explored. The State was then partitioned off into eight districts, and a collector assigned to each. To those districts where special knowledge was called into requisition, men of high scientific acquirements were sent. Their labors, as was said above, have been just concluded.

It is deemed not amiss to say something of the spirit which governed the Board in this part of the work. It was intended by them that the exhibit should be made solely from the resources of the department; that it should not impose the slightest burden on any citizen. The work was begun, carried on and concluded in this spirit. It has been necessary for collectors of material to visit every part of the State, for the plan was to display specimens, the best of each kind, along with those ordinarily met with. Whether for travel of collectors, when away from rail ways, for employment of assistants in their work, for hire of labor or for material obtained, full prices have been paid, except where compensation was positively declined. In the aggregate the amount thus paid out is considerable; but every dollar thus expended has gone to our own people, for their labor and for their commodities.

The results of the work can now be estimated with certainty. In general terms it may be safely said that the exhibit will be thoroughly illustrative of the State. It will include the woods used in the arts from the white pine of Maine to the semi-tropical palmetto. The ores of gold, copper and iron will be exhibited in their widest range. In addition will be exhibited those useful minerals, such as mica, corundum, etc., of which this State is now one of the great sources of supply. Of gem minerals, emeralds, beryls and others—the display of native specimens, cut and uncut, as well as those beautiful crystalline forms which, though not used for gems, are eagerly sought after for the cabinet, will be unequalled; since fine collections, never before put on exhibition, have, by the liberality of their proprietors, been placed at the disposal of the Board. Building stones from the rarest granites to the most beautiful marbles will be displayed. All the cereals of the State will be displayed, and they will be found to include all that are produced throughout the United States. Of the famous tobaccos of the State, full displays will be made from seven of the principal markets of the State. Of textile materials the display will embrace cotton, wool, jute, flax, hemp and silk. The exhibition of native waxes will include all the finest varieties from many of the largest vineyards in the State; while of semi-tropical productions there will be fine samples of sugarcane from the genuine sugarcane grown in the southeastern part of the State.

Our manufacturing establishments will be illustrated by various fabrics from many cotton and woolen mills. Among other industries those of turpentine, cotton seed and wood manufactures of various kinds will be included. The general scope of the exhibit has been thus indicated; the details are left to other hands. The success of the exhibit depends upon the impression which it will convey of

the State and its resources. Of that impression the readers of the Bulletin will have full opportunity of forming an opinion; the leading press notices will be reproduced in the regular or extra issues. A letter of Dr. Dabney, reporting progress, with one such press notice is hereto appended.
