Our Railroads.

We often read in the newspapers that the men who have organized and conducted the railroad enterprises of the United States are grasping and soulless monopolists. No doubt, many of them are controlled by selfish ambition, and have been unscrupulous in their methods.

Yet in their very misconduct they could not help benefiting the public. Think what wonders they have done during the last forty years! Think what would be to-day the condition of the country if we had had no railroad monopolists!

In 1883, our railroads earried four hundred million tons of merchandise worth (at twenty-five dollars a ton) ten thousand millions of dollars. But the railroads did something more than merely carry this inconceivable amount of property; they caused a very large part of it to be produced. The railroads may be truly said to have created the business that yielded this stupendous sum-total of value.
