

BERNE: Be it known that on the 6th day of April, 1885, in the City of New Berne. North Carolina, between the hours of sunrise and sunset, at such places in the various wards thereof as heretofore have been designated polling places, an elec-tion will be held for the following pur-poses, to wit: To submit to the qualified voters of the City of New Berne for rati-fication or rejection an act of the Gene-ral Assembly of North Carolina, ratified the 28th day of February, 1885, empow-ering the Beard of City Council of said City of New Berne for the amount of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars. This said notice is in accordance with a resolution of the said Board, pa-sed at their regular monthly meeting held on the First Tuesday in March, 1885, adopt-ed by virtue of and pursuant to the act of the General Assembly afore-mentioned.
