### After Bismarck—What?

Germany considers herself fortunate in having so great a man as Bismarck to guide her destinies. He is undoubtedly a marvelous ruler in his way. He takes rank with the foremost rulers of all history. There is no mere minister of a king that can compare with him, for he is the superior of even such masters of statecraft as Cardinal Richelieu; but it may be doubted whether the future of Germany would not be brighter had that nation among its rulers a half score or so of statesmen trained in public life, but with no such commanding talents as the great chancellor. Bismarck dwarts all the public men in Germany, and when he falls the reins of power there is no one to follow who will command the willing obedience of the German people. England is more fortunate in this respect. Her parliamentary system trains to public life party chiefs in whom the English people have confidence; hence the death of even Mr. Gladstone would be no such calamity to the people of England as the decease of Prince Bismarck would be to the German nation. Any intelligent reader of the newspapers could name a score of statesmen in England who would make very creditable premises; but Germany would lose prestige the world over were her great chancellor to be removed by death. We have splendid material in this country out of which to make temporary rulers, but, unfortunately, our convention system ostracizes our leading statesmen so far as the office of president is concerned. We do elect distinguished generals as chief magistrates, but our most popular statesmen are always ignored in selecting candidates for the presidential office. The best our public men can hope for after a brilliant congressional career is to become cabinet officers or foreign ministers. So far we have got along very well, but it shows how curiously popular government works in different countries. In Great Britain the governing power is always lodged in the leading statesmen of the country, while in the United States the highest position of honor and trust is generally handed over to some third-rate lawyer or nondescript politician. But the point we wished to make was, that the very greatness of Bismarck may so dwarf his successor that Germany may lose her prestige, which she now possesses, of being the foremost nation, so far as military power is concerned, of all the world.—Democrat's.
