**SHEEP PASTURES.**—Some of the disappointments and failures in keeping sheep, are due to the prevailing, but mistaken idea, that sheep can live and do well without food. "Turn 'em into a waste field and let them eat the briars and thorns and weeds," is the frequent advice of writers who never kept sheep. One might as well say that a countryman might do well in a city, by living off the garbage barrels and heaps in waste places. It is all very well for a farmer to turn a few sheep into a rough neglected field, and let them trim down the briars and weeds, if he will there provide them with sufficient food. In this way the folding of sheep upon an old field may be turned to good account. But for regular business, one can not hope to raise sheep in this way. A good pasture, roots for winter feeding, well-made clover hay, and good careful attention and management are essential to success. Sheep are fond of a variety of food—briars and weeds, and such things. Confined to that diet, they run down fast. They thrive on substantial food.—*American Agriculturist.*
