THE ELEVEN COMMANDMENTS. Mr. Geo. May Powell, of Philadelphia, has a timely article in the April Contury, on Strikes, Lockouts, and Arbitration, in which be says "One of the most satisfactory cases of conciliation and arbitration in America was the settlement of a serious strike in the Philadelphia shee trade, in 1884. This was arranged by Hon J. M. Washburn, with some co operation of the Peace Union. About \$7,000 daily wages was involved, and what proved to be a cold winter was before the working people. The settlement saved this, with all the peace and comfort, health and namels involved. Not the least of the advantages gained was the formulation of eleven rules, with notes on the same. The value of these rules and notes is shown by their having since settled several strikes in other trades and other States. They were posted up in factories, and the workmen by way of pleasantry came to call them The Eleven Commandments. They were furthermore made the basis of adjustment of a serious trouble in one of the largest institutions of learning in the country."


